Chamber ready to ROCK Los Molinos

Rockin' Los Molinos is not just the theme of the 56th Annual Los Molinos 4th of July Parade it's the goal of the Los Molinos Chamber of Commerce.

First off, the call is out for someone who thinks they have what it takes to be the new honorary mayor. Applications are out and anyone can throw their hat in the race. The seat can be bought and paid for by the candidate who collects the most money.

The Saturday before the 4th of July the Annual Los Molinos Luau returns to the Veterans Memorial Building, from 3 to 10 p.m. this time with a few new events to liven it up even more.

This year will be the inaugural Los Molinos Luau Car Show. Car enthusiasts can sign up to show and shine their four wheeled treasures for bragging rights and prizes. The entry fee is \$20 per car.

A Scorehollio Cornhole tournament will also be take place. You can sign-up for this event on the Scorehollio App



or at the event; the entry fee is \$10. There is also a craft fare, booth space is \$20. Boar Hunter BBQ will return to

feed the hungry crowd in the comfort of the air-conditioned hall. And the Band High Voltage will keep things rocking, while a waterslide will also be on hand to keep the kids cool outside.

Tickets are \$20 for adults and \$12 for kids 12 and under. Each adult ticket receives a ticket for a door prize. Extra tickets can be purchased at the door.

The fun continues of the 4th of July when the parade will close Highway 99E at 10 a.m. Parade line up is at 8:30 a.m. with the automobile category at 7:45 a.m. for judging.

Playday at the Park will begin immediately after the parade at Mill Creek Park. Prizes will be awarded after the judges have made their choices approximately at 2 p.m. at the park.



Rules and Instructions for Parade Participants

Parade lineup and registration begins at 8:30 a.m. at the parking lot of the Los Molinos Veterans Memorial Building (Vets Hall), with the parade starting promptly at 10 a.m. The numbers on the road (which is your entry number presented to you at the registration table) will indicate your position in the parade or alternatively, the position assigned you by parade monitors. Kindly keep your position during the parade and follow the directions of the parade monitors. Secure your entry number to the right side of your person or vehicle. The number must be visible to the judges so that they can judge your entry.

Please note, registration for the automobile category will begin at 7:45 a.m. and judging will begin immediately after. Drivers of all motorized vehicles must have a valid driver's license.

Please keep an adequate space between your entry and the entry in front of you, especially when approaching and passing the judges. With the exception of the Color Guard and the artist performing the National Anthem, there shall be no stopping on the parade route or in front of the judge's grandstand for any reason. Always keep a proper interval between entries to give the judges sufficient time to review and score the entries.

Excessive noise or throwing of items, e.g. candy, literature, etc. from any entry during the parade is STRICTLY
PROHIBITED. Items may be handed to parade viewers.

All minors need to be accompanied by an adult through-out the parade route.

This year's theme is "Rockin' Los Molinos." Each entry will be judged for Theme, Originality and Neatness.

Theme is defined as: "the best interpretation of the parade theme." Originality is defined as: "is the decorations special, novel, spectacular in some way?" Neatness is defined as: "a well thought out theme with a smooth execution." Most importantly, have fun!

The judges will compile all the scores at the conclusion of the parade. This is a time consuming task in order that they can make fair and impartial decisions regarding all the entries. This process should take approximately two hours. Winners in all categories will be announced at **approximately** 2 p.m. at Mill Creek Park during the annual Playday at the Park event following the parade.

Unclaimed prizes, ribbons, and trophies may be claimed at the Los Molinos Chamber of Commerce office by appointment by email at Imcoc2012@gmail.com.

Entries will be accepted by mail, e-mail or may be dropped off at Umpqua Bank, the deadline is July 1.
